

KNOW YOUR RIGHTS

If ICE agents come to you:

- Do not open the door, but keep calm. You have rights
- Ask what they are there for (and request an interpreter if you need one)
- If they ask to enter your house, ask them if they have an order signed by a judge* and if they have it, tell them to show it to you (through the window or to pass it underneath the door)
- If they **DO NOT** have an order signed by a judge*, you can refuse to let them in. Ask them to leave any information by your door.
- If they enter by force do not resist. Tell everyone who is in the house to remain silent
- If you are arrested, remain silent and do not sign anything until you talk to a lawyer

**** An administrative order from ICE (form I-200, I-205) does not give them authorization to enter your house without consent.***
